## Thinking Space 4: How to avert a skilled worker disaster? By creating equivalence!

### WHAT SITUATION — DO WE FACE?

Many sectors view skilled worker shortages with great concern, especially with a view to positions at the intermediate qualification level. Many young people prefer to enter higher education and seem to view dual training as the second-best option. How can the public be better persuaded to perceive these two education and training pathways as equivalent? This Thinking Space addresses this issue to increase the reputation of vocational education and training (VET).

### - WHAT NEEDS TO BE DONE? -



- > Create equivalence between VET and academic education and **increase** the **attractiveness** of VET
- > Continue the discussion on juridification of the German Qualifications Framework (DQR) at educational policy level
- > Consolidate dialogue with all parties involved in VET
- > **Develop** and highlight possible **solutions** that will lead to equivalence
